CUSTOMS ACT (R.S.A. c. C169)

PLEASURE CRAFT REGULATIONS

Note: These Regulations are enabled under section 18 of the Customs Act, R.S.A. c. C169.

Application of Act to pleasure craft

- 1. With the exception of the requirements imposed by the following sections of the Act, any other requirement imposed by Parts 4, 6 and 7 of the Act shall not apply to pleasure craft—
 - (a) section 19 (procedure on arrival of vessels);
 - (b) section 21 (power to make regulations as to arriving vessels and aircraft and the loading of imported goods) in so far as any regulation made thereunder requires a procedure to be followed by a vessel arriving at a customs port;
 - (c) section 23 (report inwards);
 - (d) section 33 (power to make regulations as to the loading of goods) in so far as any regulation made thereunder requires a procedure to be followed by a vessel intending to leave ports for destinations outside Anguilla; and
 - (e) section 37 (clearance).

Cargo

2. No vessel shall be a pleasure craft at any time whilst it is carrying cargo.

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Pleasure Craft Regulations, Revised Regulations of Anguilla C169-6.
